For several years now, IACES has been focused on exploring the substance abuse counseling issue in Idaho. An IACES committee, originally commissioned by ICA, successfully lobbied for changes in the counseling law to include substance abuse within the counseling purview (as stated in IBOL definition. This year, the committee has been exploring the issue of whether an "addictions counselor" would be an important addition to our counseling profession in Idaho. Exploring this issue includes concerns about whether the addition of another license would be advantageous to licensed counselors, to consumers and to other professionals. IACES is presenting a guest speaker who will present information on this topic at the IACES distinguished speaker workshop. The committee met at NNU this fall, and has been corresponding electronically regarding the area of interest. The committee does not have a recommendation to ICA at this time, pending further exploration of the "addictions counselor" issue. Here are the items that I am aware of on the public policy.

- 1) Our lobbyist was really interested in talking with legislators on putting in place a law that forces Health and Welfare, Department of Corrections and any other State agency to privatize all jobs that could be done by the public sector, which in my opinion, could be any direct care job done by the department. Then have government agencies do what there function should be and that is oversight, quality assurance, utilization review and training. This fits with the Republican philosophy. The current trend is State agencies taking over more and more private sector jobs such as the shift in substance abuse funding and the shift of drug courts doing all treatment as government workers. I proposed other lobby groups such as IMHPA join in an effort to get legislators to sponsor a bill forcing State agencies to move jobs to the private sector. The general response was, support for the idea, but they felt like social service advocacy groups need to lay low this legislative session. That being said I believe we need to talk with our legislators about the inconsistency of Republican philosophy vs the trend in the State of Idaho, which is growing public sector jobs that can be provided by the private sector.
- 2) Medicare coverage is always an issue that needs lobby activity from our members. However, if the new health care law is not shot down in the Supreme Court I believe this issue will be taken care of during the formation of the system by 2016.
- 3) Health and Welfare is talking about forcing anyone who sees Medicaid patients to use the WITS system. I have not talked with one provider that likes the WITS system (electronic health records system). Furthermore, WITS is not even approved as a federally approved vendor for EHR. My understanding is that come 2016 if a practitioner sees any Federally funded or State funded client for services they will need to use an EHR system that is approved by the feral guidelines set forth. So, it is obvious the Department of Health and Welfare needs some education on this from our members.
- 4) As of 2014, it is my understanding that people who are in drug courts and receiving treatment in IDOC will qualify for Medicaid. So, I am not sure why the State is building these models of services when they are going to be null and void once the participants are covered by Medicaid. I am pretty sure Idaho will not want to provide direct services to Medicaid clients.
- 5) If our legislators read the news and watch statistics I believe they should be very aware that mental health services are needed in the State to help its citizens. Suicide rates continue to remain at all time highs. Civil Commitments are at all time highs. State Hospitals can not keep up with patients being committed. I could assure any legislator that the cost of treating someone in ICU after a suicide attempt could treat 10's to 100's of citizens if used in helping with suicide prevention.

Anyhow, I believe if there is one sector of government that will be in constant change for the next several years it is health care. We just need to make sure our role as professionals is recognized.

Brief Summary of Governor's Address

The Governor's address and budget indicate that his priorities do not include restoring Medicaid services that were cut last year. He has stated that the cuts in government services last year are "our new normal". He recommends using any surplus revenues this year to replenish the rainy day fund, provide

tax relief and provide one time bonuses to state employees.

House Bill 260 Proposed New Rules

Most of the Medicaid Cuts from HB260 passed last year are included in proposed rules this year. These include:

- 1. Changes to the Dental Coverage (Rules Docket 16-0310-1103)
- 2. Changes to Reimbursement for Providers (Rules Docket 16-0310-1104)
- 3. Rules Docket 16-0310-1105 includes all of the following:
 - 1. Elimination of collateral contact and supportive counseling
 - 2. Requiring individuals with dual diagnosis to choose to access skill training in either mental health services (PSR and Partial Care) or developmental disabilities services (Developmental Therapy, Residential Habilitation, and IBI)
 - 3. Capping PSR services for adults with mental illness to 4 hours/week
 - 4. Eliminating service coordination for individuals on the Aged and Disabled waiver
 - 5. Changing the methodology for developing an individual's budget including limiting the appeal process unless the services are "medically necessary" and are not included in their current needs assessments.
- 4. Changes to the individual budget modifications for adults and children in the consumer direct services (Rules Docket 16-0313-1101).
- 5. Changes to Residential Habilitation Program Coordination for Certified Family Home Providers (Rules Docket 16-0417-1101)
- 6. Certification Fees for CFH Providers (Rules Docket 16-0319-1101)

These Rule Dockets will need to pass the two Health and Welfare Committees. The Senate Health and Welfare Committee has already begun to review rules and is scheduled to hear the Dental Rules (Rules Docket 16-0310-1103) on Monday, January 16th. The Senate H&W committee meets Mon, Tue, Wed and Thu afternoon at 3:00 p.m. in room WW54.

The House Health and Welfare Committee meets every even day at 1:30 p.m. in room EW42. Committees post their schedules on the legislative website www.legislature.idaho.gov under the "Calendars and Agendas" (click on each of the two Health and Welfare committees). The public can come and testify on any of the rules on the day's agenda. You will need to sign in as you enter the room, indicate which rule docket you are speaking to and whether you support or oppose the rules. You should bring a copy of your testimony in writing to be given to the committee secretary (it is also very helpful to provide enough copies for everyone on the committee).

Restore HB260 cuts

There are several legislators who have expressed concerns that the temporary cuts made in HB260 during a tough economic season are becoming permanent and the "new normal". This is contrary to the state assuring that Idaho provide accessible, quality health care and community based services for people with disabilities and low income children and families. We will provide updates on any possible legislation that is introduced this session to remove some of the more harmful language in HB260 and move the state to rebuilding a quality, sustainable health care system.

Public Hearing on the State Budget

(Feb 3rd 8:00 - 10:30 a.m.)

The Joint Finance and Appropriation Committee (JFAC) has scheduled a public hearing and invited anyone to come and share their ideas and input. Testimony will be limited to 3 minutes and people are encouraged to come early to sign up to testify. Last year, JFAC held separate hearings on the Education budget and the Medicaid budget. 1000 people came to the capitol to participate in the Medicaid budget hearing and 400 were given an opportunity to speak. This year's hearing is on the entire state budget so there will be people who will come to speak on all aspects of it.
